

Making Your Church Accessible to you ...

Like so many of our beautiful rural churches, Christ Church in Hilderstone is ill-equipped to deal with the challenges facing many of our infirm, disabled and young children: whilst we have provided temporary ramps for wheelchair and pram access, our 'characterful' porta loo leaves much to be desired and only the most intrepid visitor would enter its inner sanctum – although the spiders seemingly love it.

Almost a year ago the PCC launched its 'Access for All' project (Afa), which aimed to address

these very real issues and ensure that all those wishing to attend events at the church could do so in the knowledge that the facilities they need will be available. So, what have we achieved over these past few months?

To make the project more manageable, and ensure we had the necessary funds available, we broke the Afa project down into 5 stages, the first of which was the re-siting of the internal War Memorial. Once housed in a rather dark recess in the Baptistry, it now has pride of place in the main body of the church and took

centre stage in the commemoration service to mark 100 years since the end of the Great War.

Phase 2, sees the re-siting of the Font, again from the Baptistry, to the front of the church and should be completed by mid-February. This will bring the Font into the area by the Reading Desk, where all those attending a Baptism can clearly see, and be involved in, the celebration. It was also necessary to move the Font to allow an access door from the Bell Tower, where the new wheelchair access point will be located.

And this brings us to Phase 3: Disabled Access. With the Font now moved, an archway will be made between the Baptistry and the Bell Tower, with the side door opening to a new graduated ramp from the car park. This stage is still awaiting approval, but we anticipate commencing work in late March.

Our next stage will be the new toilet facilities inside the church building, providing toilet facilities for those with wheelchairs, as well as baby-changing facilities. This will be the most expensive part of the overall Access for All Project and we hope to start our fundraising campaign for this very shortly, so keep your eyes open. It will, of course, mean the old porta loo will be redundant, but we are confident the wildlife which inhabits it at present will find suitable alternative accommodation — maybe in our 'bug hotel' in the churchyard? This will be followed, subject to funds being available, by the final part of the project, namely the installation of a kitchen area.

All this work continues alongside the general upkeep of our beautiful Georgian church. In addition to the cost of these much-needed improvements, we have the challenges of maintaining this historic building, from repairs to the roof, to the clearing out of gutters, maintaining the churchyard and general repairs. We already have a superb Churchyard Clean-up Team (details in the magazine), but if anyone has any skills, time or just general enthusiasm, we would love to hear from you. We would like to thank all those who have supported us over this past year: to those in the village who have hosted events and the visitors who attended them; to ClIr Ian Parry on behalf of the Staffordshire County Council Community Fund for its donation towards the internal War Memorial and the Font; our parish council; and last, but certainly not least, our wonderful team of volunteers. We are most grateful to you all.

When the days are longer (and warmer), we will be running our Open Church days again and warmly welcome you all to come and see the changes in your local church. You would always be guaranteed a very warm welcome to our services too – details to be found in this magazine.

CHURCH MATTERS:

The 2019 Electoral Roll for Christ Church

The Electoral Roll for Christ Church is replaced in April 2019. To regular churchgoers and non-churchgoers alike, the Electoral Roll is something of a mystery. I would dare to suggest that even the most dedicated amongst us would not necessary have a clear idea about what the Electoral Roll is all about. So, as we approach our new Electoral Roll for Christ Church, I thought it would be a good opportunity to explain what, exactly, the Electoral Roll means.

The Church of England Electoral Roll: A Definition

This is the basic list in every parish of all those entitled to vote on elections within the Church of England. Those entitled to have their names on this roll have to be 16 years of age or more and they must reside in the relevant church parish (in our case Christ Church) or be regular worshippers in the church whose roll they wish to join. The 2019 roll will replace the existing one, which is destroyed. All those wishing to be on the new roll must apply, even if they are on the current roll, otherwise their names are deleted. This ensures the roll remains current and reflective of the parish.

A copy of the <u>current</u> Electoral Roll is displayed in Christ Church and the new Electoral Roll will be published in church on Sunday 17th March 2019.

You are free to apply or have your details removed from the Electoral Roll at any time within the roll's six year period. However, please note that if you are on the current roll, you are <u>not</u> automatically placed on the roll for 2019; everyone on the current roll must re-apply.

As part of our GDPR programme in 2018, we did undertake a new Electoral Roll, but 2019 marks the start of a new 6 year Electoral Roll. After this, the next roll will not be until 2025.

Attending the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM)

If you are on the Electoral Roll, you are entitled to attend and vote at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting, to be held in the Hilderstone Village Hall at 7.30pm on Wednesday 10th April 2019. At this meeting, the Churchwardens, Treasurer, Secretary and Benefice reports are received, and the audited accounts presented. Churchwardens are appointed and the following appointments are made:

- Election of Deanery Synod representatives
- Election of Parochial Church Council members
- Appointment of Sidespeople
- Independent Examiner or Auditor to the PCC

Anyone can attend the APCM but only those on the church Electoral Roll are entitled to vote. This meeting offers a good opportunity to see how Christ Church is doing and to meet the team.

As always, we would be delighted to welcome new members to our PCC – whether as an official member of the PCC or as an associate for, say, churchyard clean-up, flower rota or fundraising, to name but a few. Please feel free to contact any member of the PCC (details held on the church noticeboard).



From the Vicar

Do you remember that poem by Sara Coleridge called "The Months"? "March brings breezes loud and shrill, stirs the dancing daffodil.". I'm not too sure as to the accuracy of that verse but it does highlight the sense that nothing in nature is static. So, what about March? Well, the days are lengthening and the nights shortening, but it can still feel like winter, The early flowers maybe out, but they close up in the afternoon preparing for the dark and the frost. At the beginning of the month we start our Lenten journey. On Ash Wednesday (6th March) we begin our journey towards the cross.

March is action-packed. Reminders of the past and pointers to the future. A world of uncertainty, but with the assurance of God's abundant provision and his trustworthy promises. The excitement of Christmas is over, the pain of the passion looms over the horizon and beyond it the stunning and transforming joy of Easter. March may be busy but it is also a month of waiting, of preparation, remembering that Christ's death and resurrection are at the heart of our life and faith, but keeping the great passion and Easter story on hold for a little longer. I urge everyone to take time this Lent to wait on the Lord. maybe join a Lent course group, maybe do some "spiritual" reading. Sara Coleridge's poem says "March brings breezes loud and shrill, stirs the dancing daffodil". Like those daffodils, may your heart be stirred this Lent by our waiting, thrilling God.

Cooks Tips Easter Simnel cake

For the almond paste

250g/9oz caster sugar 250g/9oz ground almonds

1 tsp almond essence

2 eggs, beaten

Ingredients
For the cake
175g/6oz butter or margarine
175g/6oz soft brown sugar
3 eggs, beaten
175g/6oz plain flour

Pinch salt

½ tsp ground mixed spice (optional)

350g/12oz mixed raisins, currants and sultanas

55g/2oz chopped mixed peel ½ lemon, grated zest only 1-2 tbsp apricot jam 1 egg, beaten for glazing

Method

For the almond paste, place the sugar and ground almonds in a bowl. Add enough beaten egg and mix to a fairly soft consistency. Add the almond essence and knead for one minute until the paste is smooth and pliable

Roll out a third of the almond paste to make a circle 18cm/7in in diameter and reserve the remainder for the cake topping

Preheat oven to 140C/275F/Gas 1. Grease and line a 18cm/7in cake tin. For the cake, cream the butter and sugar together until pale and fluffy.

Gradually beat in the eggs until well incorporated and then sift in the flour, salt and mixed spice (if using) a little at a time. Finally, add the mixed dried fruit, peel and grated lemon zest and stir into the mixture.

Put half the mixture into a greased and lined 18cm/7in cake tin. Smooth the top and cover with the circle of almond paste. Add the rest of the cake mixture and smooth the top leaving a slight dip in the centre to allow for the cake to rise. Bake in the preheated oven for 1¾ hours. Test by inserting a skewer in the middle - if it comes out clean, it is ready. Once baked, remove from the oven and set aside to cool on a wire rack

Brush the top of the cooled cake with the apricot jam. Divide the remainder of the almond paste in half; roll out a circle to cover the top of the cake with one half and form 11 small balls with the other half. Place the circle of paste on the jam glaze and set the balls round the edge. Brush the cake topping with a little beaten egg

Preheat the grill to high. Place the cake onto a baking tray and grill for 1-2 minutes, or until the top of the marzipan begins to brown. Alternatively, lightly heat the cake topping using a cook's blow torch, until the marzipan is goldenbrown

COUNTRYSIDE WATCHER - SPRING IS ALIVE!

Spring is alive! I am delighted! March is here! There is a stirring in the air. Winter is over. I look around me and everywhere I look makes me smile

There are spring flowers everywhere. Standing among their smooth, shiny, heart-shaped leaves, are the 'Golden Stars', or Lesser Celandines. I see the first tiny clusters of Wild Violets. Almost hidden, are blue and white Sweet Violets on a bank under a hedge. Dog's Mercury is in flower. Their minute, greenish flowers on long slender flower spikes are among their dull green leaves. A large patch of Coltsfoot is in the verge. Their bright-faced, sulphur-yellow florets are growing quite close to the ground.

There are lovely trees around, all showing signs of Spring. The Blackthorn trees are coming into flower. The first pure white flowers are beginning to open on their black stems. The Almond trees have on a ball-gown of glorious, frothy, pink and white blossoms. There are open flowers in the buds at the tips the Horse Chestnut branches. The black buds at the tips of the Ash branches are also open revealing flowers.

This is also a month of bird song. The birds are full of the songs of Spring. On most days, the exuberant Chaffinch sings its cheerful, rollicking song. A Great Tit sings its bell-like, chiming song. I hear Collared Doves cooing invitingly across the fields. A Greenfinch, with its bright yellow wing patches and tail edges, twitters its Canary-like song. A Wren, perched high up on a branch of a bare Oak tree, sings loudly. I hear, flying over my head, the plaintive 'pee-weet' cry of a Lapwing. I also hear, coming from a copse, the rambling, chattering song of the Redwing. The Chaffinches have arrived. One calls its name incessantly from high in the bare Ash tree where it sits and sings every year. At dusk, I hear the screeching of a Barn Owl from across the valley. The Tawny Owl hoots from the churchyard.

Of course, there is the usual sign that Spring is here. I know for certain that it is when I see sheep in the fields. I hear the lambs calling for their mothers. The mothers reply, raising their heads to check that their young are safe. They then return to grazing.

I smile, knowing for sure that Winter is over and that Spring is here and alive.
